A stop at one of the apple farms in See Canyon yielded apple -appliquéd dish-towels and jalapeño-stuffed olives – hmmm – OK, not all of the things we did over the weekend were the height of good judgment...

Dinner that evening was at the (New) Old Custom House in Avila Beach, delicious food and patio-dining (under the heater!), looking at the ocean and wondering what the next day would bring.

Actually, it turns out that half of the troops went shopping the next day, while the other half took a drive through Paso Robles wine country (no wine-tasting this time), then through Fort Hunter Liggett, and up and over the coast range, where the road takes a sudden dive down to Hwy 1. If you like to drive on beautiful curvy mountain and canyon roads with few other people around, Nacimiento-Fergusson Road is a great option. The fort has miles of grassland and huge oaks hung with Spanish moss, pristine except for the occasional tank practice area. Yes, "tank", as in turrets, large cannons, and a "don't get in my way" attitude! But don't worry, if they're practicing, the MPs won't let you on the fort.

The Coast Highway was at its beautiful best, and that's pretty damn good. Relatively light traffic and absolutely perfect weather kept the pace lively as we headed south. A little lunch at Ragged Point, a few pictures of beautiful migrating Monarch Butterflies and of an even more beautiful Jaguar F-type convertible. Then back on the road, heading south to Pismo and the wrap-up dinner at Giuseppe's (mmm, great pastas!).

All in all, a nice and very relaxing trip, with enough fun, curvy roads to break up any unnecessary relaxation! We had to look hard for those fall colors, but we did find some. And we had a fantastic time with some great CCC friends – and that's what it's all about. Well, that and three days of 70 degrees and no wind on the Central California Coast.

For the new member wondering just 'what is an autocross?' here's your answer... An autocross is typically a closed course, set up with pylons or small cones that define where to turn or go straight. Your time 'on course' is timed electronically as you are 'racing' only 'against the clock'. Many BMW owners like to drive fast... (duh...!)

Central Cal Chapter will be hosting several autocrosses during 2014. We will try to schedule in the Spring and Fall months so we don't 'melt tires' during the summer! Please check online via the chapter website for upcoming dates!
