### Reflections.... By Jeff Willers

It was 1968, the summer of love. I was living in San Francisco where the music was loud and the living was loose. As all hipsters, I was driving around in a Volkswagen. True, it wasn't ratted out nor painted psychedelic colors and wasn't really a chick magnet, but it was a VW. Little did I know that I was about to have that first time, exhilarating, truly sensuous moment that would alter my life. And it wouldn't happen in the Haight-Ashbury.

My parents invited me to travel to Europe as kind of a chaperone as I had had experience traveling there and my younger sister would accompany us. We had distant relatives we needed to visit. And we rented, guess what, to travel around in? Of course it was a Volkswagen. That's all my dad had known for a few years. Volkswagens were it for daily, economical transport. He had purchased his first in 1956 and had owned four or five before our European sojourn.

Once we arrived at our destination northwest of Hamburg, greetings and the appropriate pleasantries were exchanged with our newly found "cousins". We bedded down in their sumptuous feather beds. After a typische German breakfast of cheeses, jam, soft eggs and coarse bread, we prepared for a day of local sightseeing. Hans was all too excited to be our guide.

We piled into his car, a BMW 1600. I was familiar with the Isetta, the 507, the 700 and even the Glas GT, but this was something entirely new to me. Our trip took us through the Luneburger Heide of Lower Saxony. The mist of the early morning was clearing and patches of sun revealed the glistening cobblestones of the roadbed. Hans, like most good German fahrer, did not hold back on the throttle nor the steering wheel. I thought to myself, this is something special.

The 1600 remained in a totally level attitude as we sailed nimbly across the cobblestones and careened around corners of all kinds. In a Volkswagen, the pilot is always half an arms length from the windscreen. But this car with its expansive dash seemingly going on forever and its near 360 degree "greenhouse" was a totally new experience. It was not tail happy like a VW especially on wet roads. It all seemed so effortless. I thought I was falling in love.

This was the moment. The BMW 1600's appearance of speed and competence was exhilarating. Its handling was delicate and sensuous. It was something I had never felt in a rear-engined, air-cooled car. Yes, at the time there were more exotic marques out there, but that 1600 was just the right combination of all things good.

Three years later I had my own 2002 and had a pleasurable 41 years with it. But I've never forgotten that first time.

# Rick's Ramblings

X-1 Road-test! I liked the first generation X-1, but I was one of the few. While popular in Europe, where they actually like wagons, it did not catch on here (because it looked like a wagon). Ok I get it. People in the United States who buy a SUV want it to look like one. Makes sense. So....how is it? First of all it looks like a X-3 that has been shrink-wrapped just a little and that is not bad since the X-3 looks fine. Although the exterior is not larger than the first generation X-1, there is more space inside. You can thank the deep-sixing of the six for this. With the turbo-four as the only option there was more space to design....more space! For a small price you can even option a sliding rear seat for even more space. The interior is nicer with better quality materials throughout. BMW got rid of the electronic shifter and put in a conventional one like 99.99% of the people on this planet use. Good move. I only wish that the sport mode was part of the shifting console instead of being yet another button, but that is just me. Ok...you are BMW people....you want to know how it drives. The last generation drove like a car because, in reality it was a car. This new one is a real SUV (I know...BMW wants me to say SAV). I got to take it on some really rough urban roads and it handled them like a charm which is an improvement over the old series. There is more lean in the turns but the engineers have done their magic to make it still make these turns in a crisp manner. The car feels stable at speed and the new higher seating position makes it feel like what it is.....a smaller X-3. I got to take some runs from a standing start in all of the transmission modes and the X-1 did well. You should be able to hit 60 in a little over six seconds. All in all I think BMW did a great job with this new X-1. If people were buying the old model that was really a 3 series on a raised suspension, they would still be making it. BMW is in the business of selling vehicles in the American market. This new X-1 is marketed to what people really want. I think it is a wise choice.
